# IT STARTS WITH THE RIGHT CONSOLE

While there are many choices available, Nintendo has been making family-friendly games for over 30 years, and offers characters and experiences not found anywhere else. The Nintendo 3DS is the next generation Nintendo DS, which itself followed the Nintendo GameBoy<sup>™</sup>. Since it launched in 2011, the original Nintendo 3DS has been joined by the larger Nintendo 3DS XL<sup>™</sup> and the more robust and value Nintendo 2DS<sup>™</sup>. This next generation of handheld consoles is more powerful, keeping children engaged with better graphics and deeper immersive worlds to explore. The new screens display more detailed images, and on the Nintendo 3DS & 3DS XL the top screen has the added benefit of optional 3D, or it can be locked off completely.

In addition to the Touch Screen and stylus, Nintendo 3DS & 2DS provide new ways to interact – including the camera, microphone, or built in sensors that enable children to steer games like Mario Kart 7™ by just tilting the system left or right. While the Nintendo 2DS plays all the Nintendo 3DS games in 2D, for children six years and younger parents can lock off the 3D function on the Nintendo 3DS with a password in Parental Controls.

For those old enough, the Nintendo 3DS & 3DS XL add an exciting extra dimension to portable gaming with optional 3D graphics on the upper screen. All three systems offer 3-5 hours of gaming time, and can be used while plugged in to charge at home or in the car.

#### CAMERA AND MICROPHONE
